The National Service Scheme was started in 1975 at Iswar Saran Degree College. NSS is a national platform for polishing the personality of youths, under which the they connect with national and social sensibilities to understand problems and challenges of nation and society and try to find out appropriate solutions. The main objective of the NSS is to awaken the social consciousness among the students and to actively cooperate in constructive works of nation building. NSS is a concrete program that makes education relevant according to the needs of society. This scheme fills the gap between educated and uneducated youth and its basic concept is development of education through social service.

Gandhi ji, after studying various aspects of Indian history and its problems, realized that engaging in social work along with education of youths of the country, will make every countryman aware of each other's problems and needs and they will be tied in unbreakable relationship. According to him, students should not understand that the time they have got during the period of study is not about their intellectual development, but understand that this time is the time to build their future life.

After the country became independent, the need was felt that it is important to make youth aware about the social concerns and national spirit. For this purpose, the National Service Scheme was established in 35 universities of the country on September 24 on the birth centenary year of Mahatma Gandhi.

The basic goal of the NSS is to develop the personality of the students through social service. The NSS tries to incorporate virtues like tolerance, participation, service, self-reliance and indigenous love in the personality of the students but with these motives can be attained only if they are deeply aware of the society in which they live, understand their difficulties and determine their role in eliminating them, develop a sense of social and civic responsibility and qualities of democratic leadership and try to make functional to national unity.

The ideal sentence of the National Service Scheme is "Not me but you". This sentence shows the essence of living in a democratic way, supports the need for selfless service and declares that the welfare of the individual ultimately depends only on the welfare of the whole society." Therefore, the goal of the National Service Scheme should be that every volunteer should demonstrate this ideal sentence in their daily life. With the dedication of "*Not me but you*", National Service Scheme of the college, currently runs 7 units of National Service Scheme and these are conducting various types of intellectual, cultural and social activities through their camp. The Programme In-Charge of NSS is DR. Suman Agrawal and thereare 6 Program Officers with it. About 700 students are registered in these seven units and participate enthusiastically in all programs of social consciousness.

A student registered under the National Service Scheme has a tenure of two years. In a year, each student has to do 120 hours of social service and a seven-day special camp is organized in which only 50 students are registered from each unit. In this way, each student gets 240 hours of social service in two years. It is necessary to participate in a seven-day special camp. Different types of programs were organized under these regular and special programs, which are as follows:
